Due to the unique nature of the sale items, the event historically draws customers from a diverse cross

section, including ranchers, artisans, second homeowners, machinists and maintenance personnel from

other West Coast mountain resorts. All interested buyers should bring their own trailers or make special

hauling arrangements for large purchases since deliveries will not be available.

Sale prices will be very reasonable, set at pennies on the dollar considering the original cost of the

scrapped materials.

The Boneyard entrance is located downhill from Main Lodge at the Chair 10/Goldrush Express parking lot.
