During the months of April and October hundreds of Californians receive a credit on their electric bills

Victor Manuel Silva thought his electric company had made a mistake when he saw the **receipt October 2014 he had "returned" \$ 30.** "I thought I had paid more and I were returning the money. But I explained that it is a credit for energy saving and that pleased me because **it is as if he were rewarding one good thing that makes**" Silva said resident Whittier.

Twice a year, in April and October, customers like Silva and hundreds of Californians receive a credit for saving energy through the California Credit for Climate.

Pamela Wellner, research director, marketing and community for the Center for Sustainable Energy, said the California Credit was established to help fight climate changes. Through it, the State seeks to **motivate and educate consumers to use that money for saving energy.**

The program, called 30 to minus 30, taught over 30 different **products that the customer can buy with that money, such as energy saving bulbs and water saving devices.** Program funds stands Wellner, come from money raised under the Law of Global Warming California AB 32.

This legislation requires companies that cause carbon pollution **permits if pay for that type of pollutant emitted.**" When the government get this money used to fight climate change and return to families and small businesses in their electricity bills to encourage them to save much more energy and reduce their own carbon footprint," said Wellner.

Although the Public Service Commission who will determine the duration of the program, Wellner said that for now, **will run for a while.**
